There was a sporty theme at this year's Children in Need Day in the Junior School and Nursery. Activities such as wearing their own clothes and 'guess the weight of the cake' saw them raise a brilliant £656.73!

Own Clothes Day and the Girls v Boys hockey match took place at the Senior Schools, but this year in aid of MND Association as a tribute to Old Girl and Allnian Society member, Christine Straker, who recently passed away. It was wonderful to see a total of almost £1000 raised for this great charity.

Year 9 have kicked off this year's Musical Theatre inter-house competition with a lively group of performances. Each act had its merits, but in the end it was victory for Bede and Brewer, Aidan and Plummers tied for second with Hild and Hedley, followed by Cuthbert and Ridley in fourth place. Centre of Excellence

The geography department has been awarded the Secondary Geography Quality Mark with Centre of Excellence for Fieldwork by the Geographical Association.

To achieve the award, they had submit evidence to show how we met over 40 assessment criteria relating to four key areas: pupil attainment, progress and achievement in geography; geography teaching; behaviour and relationships in geography; leadership and management in geography. Much of this evidence was work produced by pupils in their geography lessons during last year.

They also had to submit a separate portfolio of evidence to show the high quality of the fieldwork provision in the department.

Schools in the UK and overseas can apply for the quality mark which is the standard award. Some schools also apply for Centre of Excellence status as an additional option which recognises the department's contribution to quality geography at the highest level.

This year, 31 schools achieved the quality mark of which only 12 achieved Centre of Excellence status. Dame Allan's is one of just two schools awarded the Secondary Geography Quality Mark and the only Centre of Excellence in the region.



Strive!

Professor Elliott is a geneticist who is working on prostate cancer at Newcastle University. He gave a talk to 30 Year 10-13 students interested in science as part of our Strive! programme. He spoke about a career as a scientist and about his current work in which he's investigating the link between metastasis and anti-androgen drugs in patients with prostate cancer. His talk was followed by Alice and Chile, both cancer researchers who talked about their academic journey and what sort of work they were doing.

Congratulations to Emily, Libby and Imogen, who won their English-Speaking Union's Schools' Mace debate (they proposed 'This House would make voting compulsory') in November and go through to the next round in January. Well done, ladies!
