Psychology challenge (combining Art and Design)

One of the strands of psychology taught in Sixth Form is social psychology, which is the scientific study of how the thoughts, feelings and behaviours of individuals are influenced by the actual, imagined and implied presence of

others. One of the many behaviours we are observing during COVID-19 is wearing facemasks and the students are discussing whether or not you can tell someone's emotions from just their eyes.

Where do you come in?

Mrs Walton needs photos of Dame Allan's staff and students wearing facemasks whilst doing one of the following expressions behind the mask: **happy, sad, disgust, anger** or **surprise.**

Please make sure the mask is covering your nose and mouth so only your eyes upwards can be seen!

Here's Mrs Walton and her children showing you how it's done: "You can use an existing mask, but I know we have fantastic artists at Dame Allan's so you could use your art skills to design and make one if you have the material, some people are using old clothes - my

mother-in-law made ours. You could even design a Dame Allan's face mask, but remember the psychology brief of showing one of the listed emotions under your mask."
